1. (20 points) Write down the output of the following programs.

```
1. | i = 97
   | while i >= 0:
   |     print(i)
   |     i -= 10
   | print(i)
```

```
2. | def f(n):
   |     count = 0
   |     while n >= 1:
   |         n == n // 2
   |         count += 1
   |     return count
   |
   | print(f(127), f(128), f(1024))
```

```
3. | def g(n):
   |     if n = 0:
   |         return []
   |     return [n % 10] + g(n // 10)
   |
   | print(g(5120))
```

2. (20 points) Produce the following lists without using for or while loops.

1. [1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35]

2. [9, 99, 999, 9999, 99999, 999999, 9999999, 99999999]

3. [1, 3, 5, 7, 1, 3, 5, 7, 1, 3, 5, 7]

3. (20 points) Write down the output of the following code:

1. (10 pts)

```
reduce(lambda x, y: x*y, [2 for i in range(10)])
```

2. (10 pts) (very hard question, attempt only after finishing everything else)

```
funco = lambda n, f, x : reduce((lambda y, g : g(y)), ([x] + n*[f]))  
  
z = funco(4, lambda x: x*3, 3)  
print(z)
```

4. (20 points) Write down a Python function `seco(xs)` that will return the second largest element of a list `xs`. (do not use the built-in `sort()` function)

5. (20 points) Write down a Python function `from_binary(num)` that will convert a number in binary to its base 10 equivalent. (e.g. `from_binary(1101)` should return 13)
